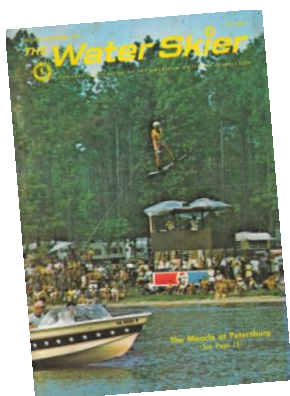

Super Aussies Top Barefoot National Meet

Visiting Australians taught the Americans a barefoot lesson August 11 and 12 in the first National Water Ski Barefoot Championships held at Cypress Gardens, Fla.

Grant Torrens led the visitors from Down Under with a first place in wake crossing, a third in start methods and a fifth in tricks. His 2146 overall points gave him a slim margin over Garry Barton who won both the start methods and tricks events but did not start in the wake crossing competition. Finishing third overall was Peter Trim.

In fact, the top American contender, Chaz St. Cyr, of Belleview, Fla., finished in sixth place overall with a fourth in starts, a sixth place tie in wake crossing and an eighth in tricks. He was declared the American national champion, with Michael Botti of Hamden, Conn., second, Bill Price of Derby, Conn., third and John Gillette of St. Petersburg, Fla., fourth.

In the women's competition, Mary McMillan of Australia, won handily over Jenny Davis of Dundee, Fla.

Stew McDonald was chief judge of the meet which drew a total of 16 contestants. Don Law, chairman of the AWSA Barefoot Committee, was technical adviser.

*1st World Barefoot
Water Ski Championships*

In November 1978, barefooting history was made in Canberra, Australia, where 54 barefooters representing 10 different countries gathered on the banks of the Molongo River, for the long awaited first World barefoot championships. As expected, members of the Australian team won every event in both men's and women's divisions. Aussies Brett Wing and Colleen Wilkinson captured the men's and women's overall honors.

Australia kept its supremacy throughout the years and until the fifth World championships, held for the first time in Europe. Then, a strong US team win at least the team overall, as well as individual gold medals. Women jump event was run for the first time and Michelle Doherty from Great Britain won the gold, which was also the first gold medal for an European barefoot. The Worlds were regularly held each couple of years gathering the best barefoot skiers on earth.

Junior skiers level has increased a lot over the years and in 1995, between two open World championships, the first World junior championships were held in Piqua, Ohio, USA, with nine countries. Only 4 years after, the inaugural senior World championships were organised with the junior in Houston, Texas, USA. This schedule remains unchanged the six following years, with an alternance between the open Worlds and the junior/senior Worlds.



In 1996, the 10th Worlds Championships were held in Fergus Falls, Minnesota, USA, and for the first time with three rounds to decide event medals. Finals with only 5 skiers gave individuals honors and team overall calculation was done after the semi-final round.

The attendance of several thousand spectators saw a hard struggle between the two rival countries and a victory for USA by a narrow margin of only 16 overall points.

During this championships, a first european gold medal in the men division was grabbed by German jumper Mario Moser.



Then in year 2006, Lake Silverado in Adna, USA welcomed all barefooters on the same site and the same year for a full eight days competition. Throughout the years, the American team still remains on the top in the open elite division, but shares victories in junior and senior competitions, mainly with the Aussies, but also with South Africa in junior division.

At least in year 2012, a very strong Australian team defeat the Yanks in Waco, Texas, USA in each division: junior, open and senior. Two years after the Aussies done it again and in 2016 & 2018, the USA took the gold in junior and senior division, but the elite Aussie team remained undefeated.

Year 2020 saw the Worlds championships planned in Sidney cancelled due to Covid 19 pandemic. However, a video tournament for juniors skiers was held at different locations across the globe and on different dates.

In 2022, a new competition dedicated to senior skiers was created: the IWWF Masters World barefoot championships, with participants gathered in age divisions, as it's already the case in some National championships such as USA, Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

At last, the year 2023 saw a new edition of open & junior World championships, adding a new under 23 division for young men and women.

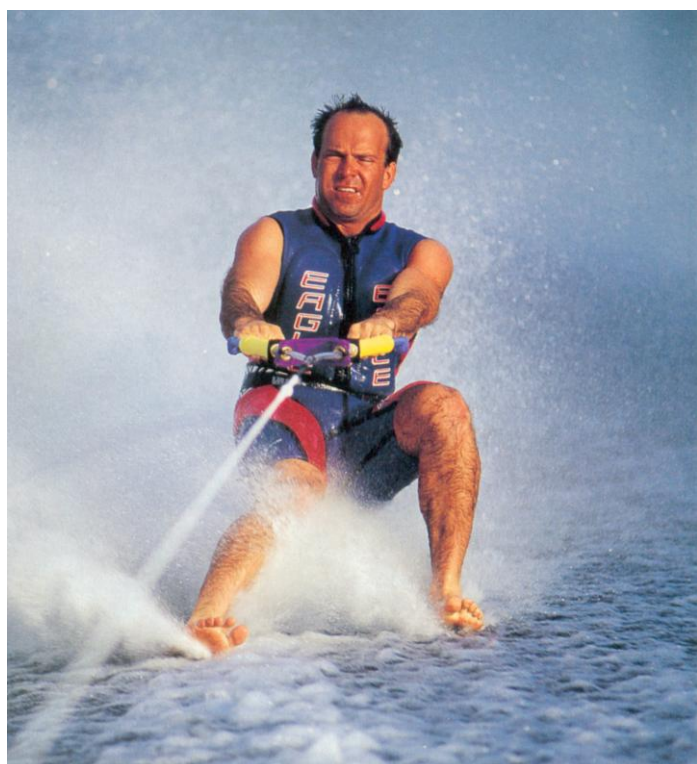

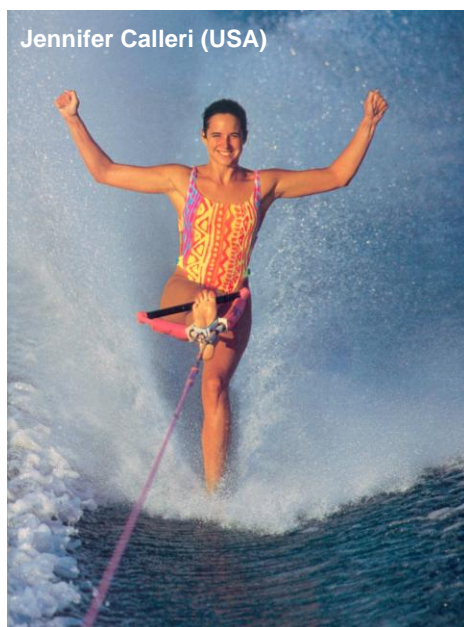

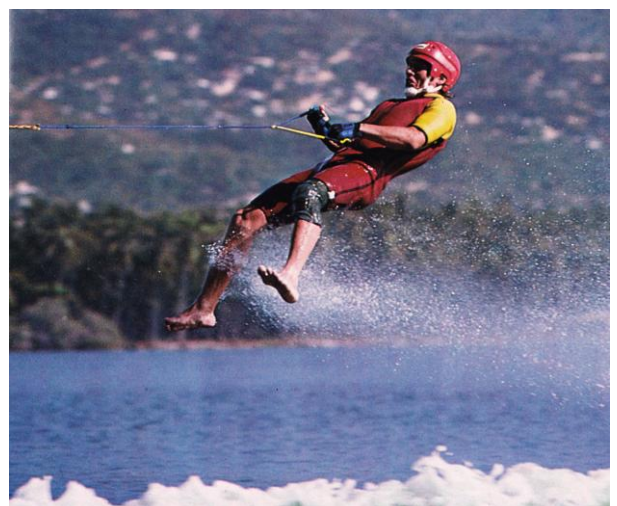
