

At the 2014 World Championships, Ashleigh set new World Records over all three events. It is very possible that she is the first ever, or one of very few athletes (male or female) to have ever done this in the history of Waterskiing and most certainly the only one of "modern times" to have achieved this. In every round of the slalom event at the Worlds, Ashleigh broke the World Record. The Slalom World Record of 17.0 was set 13 years ago, in 2001, by Nadine De Villiers of South Africa. Recently at the 2014 AO Championship, Ashleigh went on to officially break this record to 17.2. The Women's World Slalom Record was the longest standing 3-event record in Barefooting history.

Ashleigh is one of the most incredible athletes and her accomplishments in the sport of barefoot waterskiing make her one of the greatest female barefoot waterskiers of all time. At the age of twenty-two, she already holds all current World Records. Holding all of the World records at the same time is a huge accomplishment; even more impressive is her desire to push these limits even further. Ash strives to change the opinions of the girls and women in the sport of barefoot waterskiing about exactly what is achievable.

At the 2014 Australian National Championships, Ashleigh won the Open Women's Division for her 5th consecutive year; she also produced the highest trick score, outperforming the Open Men's Competitors. Aside from skiing, Ashleigh is a very competent Judge and Scorer, judging and scoring at regional, state and national levels.

Ashleigh Stebbeings is also an accredited coach and coaches' barefoot waterskiing in both Australia and America. She was recently appointed as the Australian Junior Team Coach. Ashleigh has successfully run training clinics across Australia as well as running "come and try" days for her local club. She is a highly respected member of our barefooting community, constantly improving on her achievements while assisting others in achieving theirs.

Ashleigh has emerged into a fine young woman and an exceptional sportsperson and role model. Ashleigh truly is a student of the sport, she is dedicated, passionate, and she has a work ethic second to none. She is an outstanding ambassador for both her sport and her
