MINUTES

of the 4th MEETING of the WORLD BAREFOOT COUNCIL of the W.W.S.U.

held in ACAPULCO, MEXICO on the 29th and 30th of November 1982.

The Chairman opened the meeting at 0914 and welcomed the members. Credentials The procedures agreed were as follows:

- Members have speaking and voting rights.

- Substitutes may be present and observe, but are not allowed

to speak unless consulted.

- Don Cameron Grant to be allowed as observer. His Federation had advanced him as a replacement for Mike Strubble, but as yet there was no letter from Group 1. However it seemed certain he would be a member or substitute in the near future.

- Mark Hanson was recognised as acting member in the absence of

a Group 1 member. (Mike Strubble)

The Chairman outlined the discussion procedure. He would introduce the subject with a few first words, and would then go round the table, giving each member an opportunity to speak on the subject, after which it would go to a vote if necessary. Members would vote as individuals and not as Groups.

There appeared no rules for the election Election of Chairman of Chairman other than that the incumbent should hold office till after the World Championships. All were agreed that the Chairman elect should take the chair at the end of the meeting. After some discussion it was agreed the election should be as in the Agenda.

Credentials were then recorded as follows:

These were approved at the end of Minutes of the 3rd Meeting the London Meeting.

Nominations for Chairman

Proposed John Cornish, seconded Bill Price that Franz Kirsch be reelected.

Proposed John Morgans, seconded Brian Carroll that Bob Wing be nominated. Proposer was not against FK but thought the Chairmanship should alternate between the Groups. The reason for not suggesting this before was that he had been happy with Franz.

Bill Price agreed the Chairmanship should be rotated, but against this was the undoubted advantage of Franz Kirsch's proximity to the President

Charles Ramsey said it would be impractical for the Secretary to be of another Group than the Chairman, and members should consider a new Chairman's choice of secretary in his own Group.

The meeting agreed that the vote should be a simple majority, and that it whould be by secret ballot.

For Franz Kirsch 6 votes 3 votes. For Bob Wing

Franz Kirsch waa applauded on his reelection and thanked the members for their expression of confidence. He said that to do all that the office called for was a heavy burden, which he had borne cheerfully enough, but now was the time to delegate specific tasks to various members. He cited the example in the Group 2 Barefoot Council where the handling of Judges matters had benn delegated to a member, with much success. He would make a start on apportioning certain tasks. The costs of running the office were also considerable, and a sharing of work would spread some of the costs. It was agreed that there should be delegation of specific

areas to individuals.

Competition Forms The forms used at this Worlds cuased Item 4.14 problems for some Judges who had not seen them. The Chairman would seek agreement on formats, and would undertake to make master films for local reproduction for use at Worlds and other competitions. The formats could be changed in the light of experience.

- <u>Homologation Dossier</u> The proposal along the lines of the classic example circulated by the Chairman received only one response, from Harry Robb who mistook it for a record application.

There followed a general discussion on features of the format; and Bob Wing proposed Ken Port as task man.

tem 4.14 Safety Representative for the Worlds Bureau.

This person should give advice on the medical aspects of the sport, e.g. jumping for women. However there was doubt that it had to be a doctor. In fact doctors do not seem to agree on matters such as the physiological effects of jumping. The Chairman proposed we find in each Group a person whose advice could be asked on specific subjects before the Council. Dick Hamming's name was put forward.

On an <u>administrative matter</u> the Chairman said that when letters are sent on W.W.S.U. headed paper, copies must go to J.J. and Peter Pearl and the Council members. Thus this headed paper is not to be used for non-official purposes. Only if a letter is sent to Franz Kirsch with a note that no copies are sent, will he copy it and distribute it.

Chief Judge's Report, Distribution

Proposed by Bob Wing, seconded by John Cornish,
That a full Chief Judge's Report be circulated to all. To the
Council members, this report should include performance reports
on all officials, including adverse reports and marked strictly
confidential. This should be done for World and Group Championships.

Proposed by Ken Port, seconded by John Morgans, That a similar independent report be made by the Assistent Chief Judge at a World Championships and sent strictly confidential to the Council members.

Proposed by Bill Price, seconded by John Cornish,
That the last resolution be extended to Group Championships.

Calculators It was agreed to make provision in the rules for 3 calculators (to be called Scorers to distinguish them from a reference to the electronic variety), i.e. a Chief Scorer and two others from separate Groups. Also agreed was the appointment by the Chief Judge of a Chief Judge's Assistent from the Judges.

Records Certificates will be issued for the records on endurance and speed recorded as approved in the minutes of the Canberra meeting.

The Meeting decided to make it a requirement that the actual sheets written by the Judges should accompany a record claim.

ACTION

International Competitions The Chairman said that in future the Council must be informed of international competitions to be held. This was not done in the case of Marine World.

3rd World Championships in Acapulco

The W.W.S.U. was badly let down by the Organisers, and the competition hung in the balance for a time. Due to the hard work and cooperation of a number of officials and supporters, all could be got ready in time.

Bob Wing concluded alls well that ends well, but nevertheless it was not international standard, and cited several deviations from the rules

- the familiarisation was not according to C206
- Judges were allowed to confer between runs.
- there was no backwards facing speedo
- there was no Technical Director.

The Chairman answered that in view of the many deficiencies and anticipated problems, the familiarisation could not be allowed to overrun. The extra speedo arrived too late to be fitted. A Technical Director nominated by the Organisers failed to show, and one of the supporters was promoted to the post. The only boat was supplied by Bill Price after Mastercraft let us down at the last minute.

Bob Wing said the ramp was better for finals and so the non-finalists were at a disadvantage in the overall scores.

Ken Port, the Homologator, said the ramp height was unstable.

It was not to say when it became too bad and have to give all starters a rerun. After the preliminaries, the ramp was pulled out and fixed. It was reinstalled and the course had to relaid.

It was a case of making do, making the best of what was possible.

Charles Ramsey gave a review of the activities of the Computer subcommittee, which was not much. He had been in contact with Serge Boute and Colin Ellison, but there had been no other response. The jump event was done in this Worlds by computer (Spectrum) with good results. There was no doubt this would be the way of the future.

1983-1984 Rule Book

French language. J.J. recalled that all the paper work was done in English. If someone then wants it in French, he should do it in French from the English original.

The printing costs should be covered by advertising. S sponsor could in fact be expected to do more, including costs of sending.

The Meeting was adjourned at 1910, till the next day.

The Meeting reconvened on 30-11-82 at o810.

The Secretary produced text for rule Cl104 which was accepted.

The <u>Tricks Record</u> of Ron Scarpa of 4140 was according to Harry Robb confirmed by the video.

John Morgans had objections to the way the paperwork requirement was being neglected, but Bob Wing thought if it was clear the skier did it he should get the record

The Chairman undertook to write the passes from the video and report OK or not, and with an amendment by Bob Wing that the tape must match up with the score sheets, this was put as a resolution and passed unanimously .

There followed a brisk discussion on the Group 2 proposal to abolish start methods. The Group 3 representatives were strongly in favour of retaining starts, which are popular and a major event in Group 3. The objections do not support such a drastic step. The skiers want starts kept in.

Proposed by Franz Kirsch, seconded by Mark Hanson: That Start Method be deleted from World Championships.

Amendment proposed by Ken Port, seconded by Charles Ramsey: That the resolution apply only to the Men's Division.

T e Chairman called a 5 minute recess, aand after the meeting reconvened. he declared he did not want to use his casting vote for this important issue, and abstained. Thus the motion lost.

WISCH

At 0915 hrs, the President of the W.W.S.U., Mr J.J. Finsterwald joind the meeting and was brought up to date on the discussions on the srart method question. He regretted the absent members vote could not be taken. A proposal to solicit it at short notice was defeated.

J.J. went on the bids for the Worlds Championships. Shreveport had made a bid, but it was not supported by the AWSA.

New Zealand will make a bid.

Thorpe is interested.

Ken Port said there was no intention in the BWSA to bid.

Italy declared its intention to bid. Canada will be interested in 1986.

J.J. emphasized the importance of T.V. and asked the Council to think of a camera in the boat. He went on to clarify the contract situation for T.V. rights, and explained the arrangement with Ken Harris at this Worlds.

Bill Price suggested using Southern Video Productions to make a professional job of the Ken Harris tape, and asked if the proceeds could go to the W.B.C. to cover some expenses. John Morgans felt the Executive Board is not giving due attention to barefooting, even though in the Constitution all divisions are equal, There was general consensus on these remarks, and J.J. saw this point but did not see how to get better attention for barefooting.

The Chairman asked if J.J. could leave the rule book publishing to the W.B.C., including the financing. Maybe there would be a net profit.

J.J. was prepared to agree on the condition he knows who is involved.

The President left the Meeting at 1000 hrs.

03-10-32 1900 Tricks records. Kim Lampard The meeting was closed due to members leaving to catch their flights.

Diary of the Preparatory feam Franz Kirsch and Charles Ramsey arrived in Adapulco on 14-11-32 and wece later joined by Bill Price. Members were not met. Arrival not known by hotel (Plaza). No bookings. Great difficulty getting rooms, only by surrendering credit cards. Mon 15-11-92: Made contact with J.S. Mot at Turismo by minor official who asked what we wanted. Principals not available. Spent morning giving details again of requirements. P.M.: 3 hours work with Producciones Acapulco on tech regmts. Evening: waited about 3 hours to see Director Turismo. No luck. Told to return next a.m. 0900 to see Imez (dep. director). $3^{1}/2$ hours getting J.J. on the phone. Mastercraft backs out of the boat deal. Tue 16-11-32: Waited in Turismo till 1100. No principals, but nobody in Turismo except principals knows anything. Out to the site, to see that nothing at all was done. Decision made to move courses since promised spectator facilities at planned site not built. Negotiated Cardena's help. Correctoraft unable to supply boats. Discussed Bill Frice to bring own boat Ged 17-11-32: 0800 breakfast meeting. 0900 Prod Aca. 1100 Turismo. Unable to see principals. Minor official asks ur what we want. Use of phone in Turismo inhibited for outside calls. Phone J.J. re cash bond. Letter on this to Director's Secretary. 1200: Po the office of the Mayor of Acapulco to solicit help. 1345: asa result, our first interview with Medina (Director). since arr 3 days ago, this is first contact with anyone in authority. Medina accepted the major requirements and delegated authority to Jose Ordaz, except press matters. Hade an appointment for Friday 1200. Near midnite, battery requested for computer arrived. Checked. Dead. Thur 18-11L82: 0900 at Turismo for cheques (personal expenses) No chequer. Return at 1700. Back at 1730. Nothing done; no cheques. Attempting to make appointment with Hedina via Secretary, discovered Medina in his office, but too busy to attend to matters. Instructed J.S. to write the letter to cash the bond. At 2200 hrs, Ordaz came to hotel with technicians, and listed the lumber needed. (repeat of data given Monday). Appointment 1000 Friday with promise everything would be ready. Fri 19-11-32: Ordaz to hotel with technicians. Lumber list given again. Appointment with Medina (1200) confirmed. 1100 hrs. 2 batteries received (for computer). 1200 waiting in outer office till Medina sent word he could not nee un. 1200hrs: seen by Eugenio (Imaz) who asked what is missing at the site. Go through wash list once again. Malkie talkies then produced with dead and corroded batteries. Rope and W/T batteries

Over the weekend, Council members, Officials and supporters put the competition together with practically no appearance by the organisers.

Fuel, lumber for tables, public address, and office equipment eventually arrived. The Technical Director never showed up.
