# THE EVENTS

Our sport of barefoot Water Skiing consists of three main events in each round and they are....

## TRICKS

Each competitor is allowed two passes through the course, each of fifteen seconds duration. In this time, skiers will attempt as many tricks as possible taking into account the high-

er scoring tricks according to their degree of difficulty. The types of 'tricks' you will see are multiple surface turns, somersaults, line steps, rope on toe etc. The skier may enter the course forwards or backwards at whatever speed they nominate although its commonly between 65 to 72 kph. At the beginning of each pass, they will perform a particular *start method* which also scores according to the degree of difficulty.

## WAKE SLALOM

The skier is again permitted two fifteen second passes through the course and it's mandatory that one of these passes shall be backwards. The

skier scores according to the number of complete crosses over the wake that can be accomplished in each pass. The score increases for each successful cross on one foot and the skier must clear the wash completely on each side of the wake. As a matter of interest, Master skiers can attain up to nine "one foot" crosses forwards, and up to ten "one foot" crosses backwards in each 15 second pass.

## JUMP

This is a truly spectacular event which takes place directly in front of the main crowd. The skier may call up to a maximum speed of 70 kph, skis over the fibreglass jump, attains







as much height and distance as possible, land and *ski away* to score. Each skier has three jumps in each round and the longest scoring jump wins. Note: Barefoot skiers are now reaching distances in excess of 26 metres from Jump to touchdown.

### THE SITE

The site is situated at Helles park, Liverpool on the upper reaches of Sydney's Georges River. It lies between the old Liverpool bridge and the new expressway bridge, above the weir, and is both freshwater and non-tidal. Because of the weir, there is no through traffic on this portion of the river and it's released under special Aquatic Licence for the purposes of Barefoot Water Ski training and competition.

The Australian Barefoot Water Ski Club members have spent four years profiling the river banks, cultivating lawns and creating what is now recognised as one the best barefoot sites in the world.

### THE CROWDS

10,000 to 15,000 people attend a World Championship over the six day period, depending on weather and promotion. The main days are the Saturday and Sunday at the end of the week when the final rounds are contested. On these days, anywhere from 3,000 to 5,000 visitors can be expected per day. We usually have in

the order of 1,000 overseas visitors both accompanying the various teams and coinciding their overseas holidays to include the World Championships. A "Festival Week" is being planned for Helles Park while the Tournament is being held. Although the festival is largely cultural, it will also include diversified activities of interest to visiting crowds.

# INTERVIEW

## DODD DWYER

Currently ranked World Number 1, Australia's own Dodd Dwyer talked with us after arriving back home from the U.S. about his barefooting aims now and in the future.

### **Could you tell us which titles you currently hold?**

I'm current Australian Champion, Asian-Australasian Champion and the World Record Holder for jump with a distance of 27m. I also won a few tournaments in America as well as being World Games Champion from the event held in Amsterdam in August.

### **I'm not familiar with them, what are they about?**

It's a big thing over in Europe with many countries competing. It's not just Water-skiing but all sports, I guess you could compare it to a sort of mini Olympics. It was also a venue for the unusual sports to try and impress the Olympic officials and get their sport included in the Games, that's what it was really about. Unfortunately, we didn't get to see any of the other sports because they were all held at different venues but we watched the three event guys going off.. It was really quite an important tournament for us because our goal is to try and get Waterskiing included in the Olympics.

### **When did you first start skiing?**

I was 7 years old when I started skiing. I grew up in a little town called Esperance in WA and my mum and dad were into waterskiing. At some point, someone taught my dad to Barefoot and he just fell in love with it. Naturally, I got dragged into it, with them taking me out on the front of their skis from the time I was knee high to a grass hopper. It seemed to me just a natural progression when dad taught me to barefoot. I was about 8 years old and it was a bit of a feat back then because we didn't have any booms or anything.

### **How did you begin your competition career?**

We did some training at weekends and

made friends with some guys from the WA barefoot club, in Perth. They were holding regular competitions and sending teams interstate for the nationals each year. We soon found ourselves driving up to Perth every so often to compete. I was the youngest competitor and, at times, this was daunting but I guess being the centre of attention wasn't so bad. Then, I started to catch up with the guys from other states and eventually won two National Championships in my division which was Sub Junior Boys. I progressed on to Junior Boys but started to get a bit sick of it as none of my friends were involved and ended up staying away for a few years.

### **What brought you back?**

My father moved to Sydney and, at that stage, my life wasn't going anywhere so I made the decision to move over here with him and try to make a go of it with skiing again.

### **How old were you when you moved to Sydney?**

I was 18 when we moved, that was ten years ago. I worked for dad in his construction business and hooked up with a guy called Greg Shipton who used to be heavily into the barefooting scene. He was about the only person I knew over here and we started skiing together. Eventually, I got into the Australian Team as a reserve and saw my first World Titles in Canberra and it turned out to be exactly what I needed for inspiration. During the competition, I was lucky enough to have Mike Seipel stay at my house with his fiance Gwen for a week or two. I also had a couple of Canadian guys staying. We were lucky enough to get Mike out on the water and video taped him. Before he left, he invited me to come and work in his ski school for the winter which I did

and, whilst there was no money involved, it was a great deal. Anyway, after he left Australia, I did a lot of training and studied the video tape for hours trying to adapt my style to his and as a result went ahead in leaps and bounds. By the time I got to the States I could do a lot of the surface turns and tricks together with a lot of the more difficult manoeuvres.

### **How long do you intend to keep competing, I mean can you make a living from this?**

Even though no one's making a lot of money out of barefooting, I feel that as long as I can keep travelling and paying the bills I'm happy to do it. That's what I've been doing for the past ten years although I don't have a lot of possessions or a nice car, I make ends meet.

### **Do you follow a planned diet?**

I'm not strict with my diet but I do watch what I eat. I have read a lot of literature on it, so I'm fairly well versed in Diet and what's happening in the body and generally eat healthily.

### **What about a Fitness routine?**

When I'm in proper training, I run 5-6k m each day and do a 2 hour workout at the gym. The skiing will sustain you but if you want to make great improvements in strength and flexibility, it requires the extra gym work and some cardio-vascular work.

### **What will be your preparation for the World Barefoot Championships to be held in March in Liverpool, N.S.W.?**

I haven't actually started yet. I've been away for four months and only just got back so I'm not even thinking about it yet. Just before Christmas we have a few small tournaments, where it's per-



fect for me to have a warm up. Plus, these low pressure tournaments provide me with the perfect opportunity to break records.

**Is there a lot of pressure to break records?**

There isn't anything like to go out there. As a competitor, you have to enter games and you have to win. Who is going to win?

When I was first learning to jump, I was always being told to keep my feet under me and, every time I went to jump, my feet were always under my hips and he was landing on his stomach. Mike told me he could get more distance flying inverted. So, he just went ahead and went about the way of getting inverted, which is what we call it, how to land and how to fly away. Really, it has revolutionized the sport. Remembering that you have to treat it with a lot of respect. Everyone should learn the orthodox way first before going on to the inverted style.

**When you were first learning this new style, what did you have to do to prepare yourself mentally?**

You don't have much time on the ramp, so the whole thing is dependant on being in the correct body position when you're on the ramp. You aim for a position that will achieve maximum height which equals maximum distance. It's all in the preparation, the ski up to the ramp being the most critical thing. This style has been done in competition for about three years now. There aren't any women doing it yet but we're hoping this year one of them might, either Jennifer Calleri, a top ranked barefooter in the US, or our own Sharon Stelkenberg, is current World Champion and World Record holder in the jump.

**Tell us about your season in the States?**

This was the first year America had opened their national competition to international skiers (now called the US Open) and both John (Pannay) and I did very well. I picked up a couple of events at their State Titles before leaving for the World Games in Amsterdam where I won the trick event, came second in the jump and second in the slalom and then won the overall. It was a really great time for me. Next, I went to London where I did some coaching and skied in the British Nationals where I'm happy to say I won. Then, it was back to America's West Palm Beach for a weeks training before the U.S. nationals.

**What are your future ambitions, what's left for you to do?**

I'm currently ranked World Number One, although not World Champion but I don't believe any one person will dominate the sport. I think, at the top level, we are all closing in on one another.

We would like to thank Dodd for his time and look forward to his upcoming report from NSW Barefoot Club site.

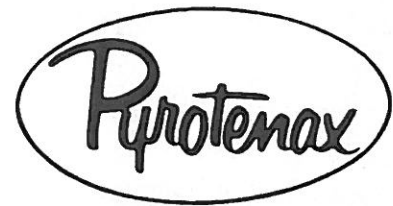

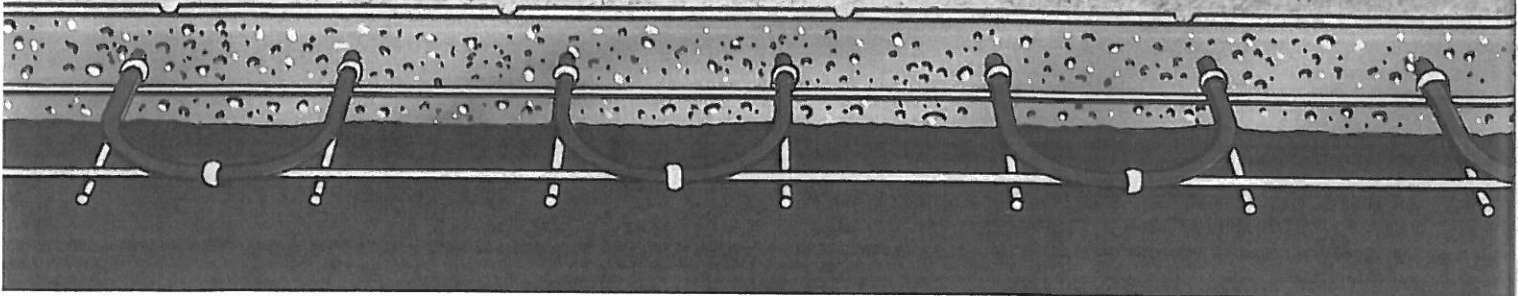

# Australian Barefoot Water Ski Club

(Barefoot Division of the Australian Water Ski Association)

This year looks like being one of the busiest seasons for quite a while with the reason being Barefooting's jam packed calendar which includes the 1994 World Championships to be held at Helles Park, Liverpool.

We began the season with a Pro Night Jump at Canberra for the Australia Day Carnival and a big thank you to all the sponsors associated with the event for their support. This event drew a big crowd estimated at around 1,000 people who were all treated to a great display of some very significant jumping.

John Pennay took 1st place with David Williams in 2nd place and Robbie Tink was 3rd. Dodd Dwyer was unsuccessful in taking out the prize money. While he did jump 30 metres, Dodd was unable to ski away. This is surely a sign of things to come and we wish Dodd the best of luck in landing these enormous jumps and possibly taking out the World Championship with a new world record. It would be nice to do it in front of a home crowd too. Brett Fritsch also jumped well in the first round with a personal best of 26.4 metres and skied away earning himself a place amongst the top skiers. Unfortunately, Brett broke the handle on his next jump and injured his hand. After many hours at the Woden Valley Hospital, the diagnosis was a broken thumb. This put Brett out of competition until the NSW State Titles and possibly the chance to make in into the Australian Team. Although I hear there is a slight chance and I wish him the best in trying to make it into the team. I would also take this opportunity to congratulate Brett on his scores in the N.S.W. Higher School Certificate and gaining a place for a Medicine Degree at University. Congratulations and well done.

The next tournament on the Calendar was the Australian Masters at Liverpool, one of the selection tournaments for the Australian Team. With this added incentive, the competition was hotly contested by each of our top men and women skiers. The men's overall went down to the last event before John Pennay came out on top with a total of 5,820.48 to Dodd Dwyer's Overall total being 5,736.31 with 84.17 points between them. Brett Sands was also successful in taking out the Slalom Masters. Dodd Dwyer won the Jump Masters with an overall jump of 50.8 metres over 2 rounds.

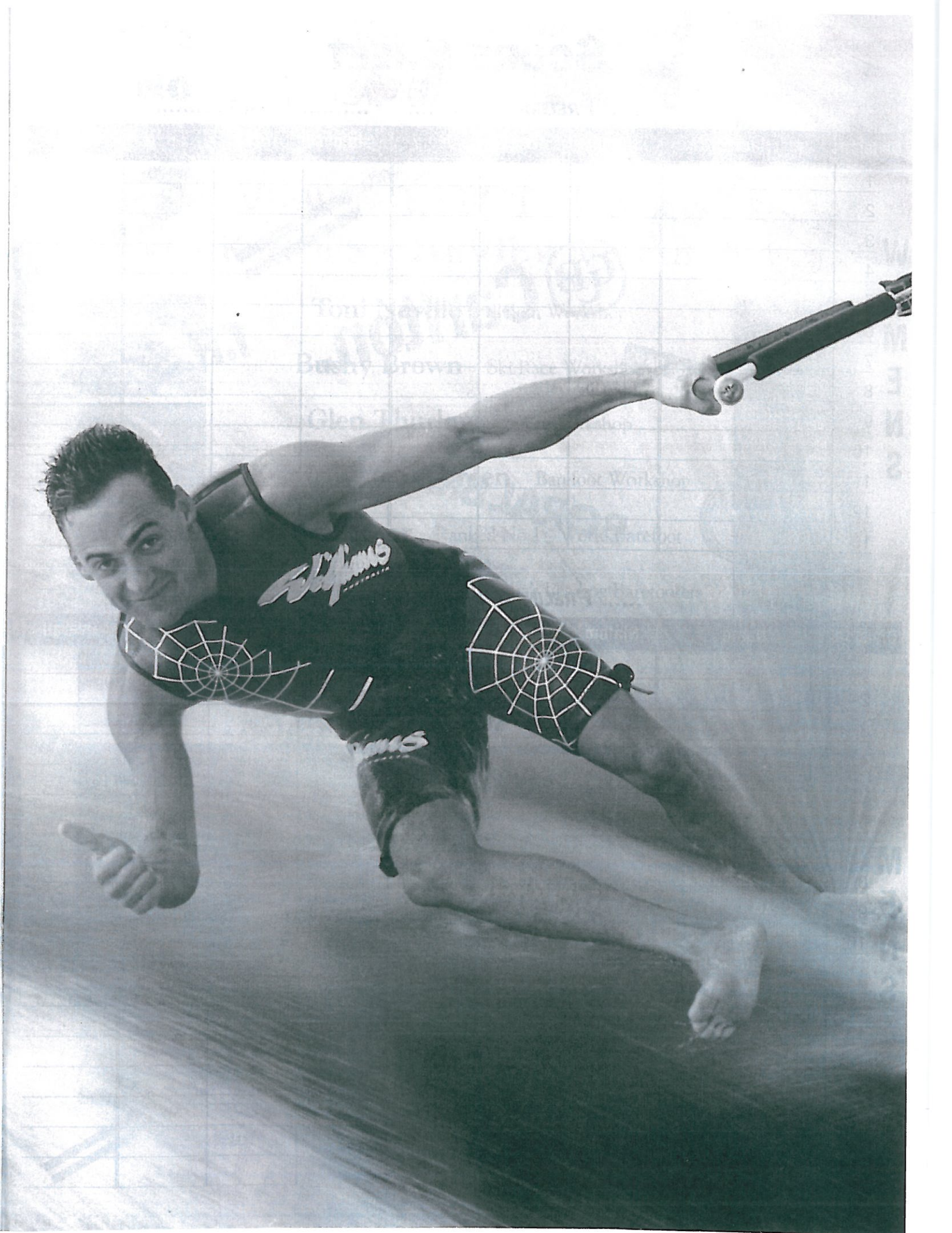
John Pennay skied well in all events with Tricks providing his overall best scores for the tournament. As usual, Sharon Stecklenberg skied consistently to take out the overall, with 2,000 points in each, Women's Masters for 1993/94 season. Julie Young, ACT, also skied well coming 2nd in Slalom and Tricks and 5th in Jump. The results from this competition count for team selection for the championships this month.

ACT State Titles, held on the weekend of the 12th-13th February 1994, were another selection trial for the Australian Team with the Men's and Women's Open being contested by our top 6 men and top 4 women skiers. John Pennay set a blistering pace in the Men's Tricks with a 7040 point trick run and, in doing so, has set an unofficial world record. Congratulations John. Ken Derry won the Slalom event with two rounds of 17.4 giving a combined total of 34.8. The Jump was won by John Pennay with a combined total of 47.1 metres giving him the ACT Mens State Title. I also learnt that Dodd Dwyer was unable to ski in the second round on Sunday because all his ski gear was stolen on Saturday night leaving him unable to ski in the rest of the tournament. If anyone finds or knows of the whereabouts of Dodd's gear please notify the Canberra Police or the Australian Team Manager, Mr Peter Laurent in Canberra. In the Women's Open, Julie Young won the Trick event while Sharon Stecklenberg won both the Slalom and Jump event. Gizzy Halasz tricked well bringing home the Bronze behind Sharon. Once again, congratulations from all and well done. In the Boys' Division, Robert Anderson won the Trick event with Victorian, Glenn Swan taking out both Jump and Slalom events. Congratulations guys for on your wins. In the other Divisions: Junior Girls' - Kelly Stumbles from the ACT won all three events while brother Scott won all three events in the Junior Boys'. The Stumbles household must be very proud of their new 93/94 ACT Junior Champions.

I would like to say GOOD LUCK to the Aussie Team competing in the Panther's 9th World Championships here in Australia. So, to all fellow skiers, friends and followers of the Sport of Barefooting, see if you can make it to Sydney between 15th-20th March 1994 and cheer on our home team to an Australian Victory!
